PHOTOGRAPH OF PORT ADELAIDE taken Friday 24 November 1871.

It shows the original wooden bridge from Port Adelaide to Le Fevres Peninsula erected about 1857 removed about 1878. It also shows the site of the Glanville, now the Sugar Coy's Wharf, the Government Dockyard, Hawker's Creek, the house J.C. Hawker occupied, (Mr. Hawker was Controller of Customs, and married a daughter of Captain Lipson R.N. the first Harbour Master) Fletcher's Slip on which is the Elder liner "Beltana" which struck on a rock, slipped 13th November 1871, mislipped Saturday 2nd December 1871. The photo also shows the Alberton Wesleyan & Baptist Chapels, & c. *negative with original*

The Shipping

Starting from the bridge the vessels are, omitting the small coasters. In the stream near the bridge, cutter "Edith" yacht of Governor Sir J. Fergusson at the Copper Coy's Wharf.
